Re: WoodStrawTM

Mr. Perry:

You requested that Ecology review the WoodStrawTM product and see whether it fits as a best management practice (BMP) in Washington State. We have completed our review and determined that the WoodStrawTM erosion control mulch can be added to BMP C121: Mulching as a wood-strand product. BMP C121 can be found in Volume II of the February 2005 Stormwater Management Manual for Western Washington and Chapter 7 of the September 2004 Stormwater Management Manual for Eastern Washington. The category of wood-strand has not been added to the manual yet but will be included as an addendum in the future. The standards and guidelines for wood-strand mulch will include the following information:
